I N D I C T M E N T

17 COUNT I: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
18 California, by this Indictment, hereby accuses HARRY RUDOLPH
19 ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK, and WILLIAM J. GOLDWAG of a Felony, to-
20 wit: Violation of Section 182.4 of the Penal Code of the State of
21 California, in that beginning on or about the 1st day of January,
22 1973, and continuing thereafter to on or about the 1st day of
23 April, 1974, in the County of Orange, State of California, the
24 said HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK, and WILLIAM J. GOLDWAG
25 did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously conspire, combine, and
26 agree together and with each other, to cheat and defraud Leroy
27 Kemp, Darla Benson, Herbert Foosaner, and Sharyn Dalton by means
28 which are in themselves criminal, and did obtain money by false
pretenses and by false promises with fraudulent intent not to per-
form such promises.

FIRST OVERT ACT

25 That on or about the 25th day of October, 1973, at and in the
26 County of Orange, State of California, and in pursuance of said
27 conspiracy and to effect its object, the said PAUL L. BLACK and
28 WILLIAM L. GOLDWAG did consult with, and make certain represen-
tations to, Leroy Kemp.

2 That on or about the 7th day of December, 1973, at and in the
3 County of Orange, State of California, and in pursuance of said
4 conspiracy and to effect its object, the said PAUL L. BLACK did
5 consult with, and make certain representations to, Darla Benson.

8 THIRD OVERT ACT

9 That on or about the 18th day of January, 1974, at and in the
10 County of Orange, State of California, and in pursuance of said
11 conspiracy and to effect its object, the said PAUL L. BLACK did
12 consult with, and make certain representations to, Herbert Foosaner.

15 FOURTH OVERT ACT

16 That on or about the 5th day of March, 1974, at and in the
17 County of Orange, State of California, and in pursuance of said
18 conspiracy and to effect its object, the said WILLIAM L. GOLDWAG
19 did consult with, and make certain representations to, Sharyn
20 Dalton.

21 COUNT II: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
22 California, by this second count of this Indictment, hereby further
23 accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK, and WILLIAM J.
24 GOLDWAG of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of Sections 484-487 of the
25 Penal Code of the State of California, in that beginning on or
26 about the 25th day of October, 1973, and continuing thereafter to
27 on or about the 25th day of November, 1973, in the County of Orange,
28 State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK,
and WILLIAM J. GOLDWAG did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously
take the personal property of Leroy Kemp consisting of money, all
of a total value in excess of two hundred dollars.

COUNT III: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
California, by this third count of this Indictment, hereby further
accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK, and WILLIAM J.
GOLDWAG of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of Sections 484-487 of the
Penal Code of the State of California, in that beginning on or
about the 7th day of December, 1973, and continuing thereafter to
on or about the 20th day of March, 1974, in the County of Orange,
State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L.
BLACK, and WILLIAM J. GOLDWAG did willfully, unlawfully and felon-
iously take the personal property of Darla Benson consisting of
money, all of a total value in excess of two hundred dollars.

COUNT IV: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
California, by this fourth count of this Indictment, hereby further
accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK, and WILLIAM J.
GOLDWAG of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of Sections 484-487 of the
Penal Code of the State of California, in that beginning on or
about the 18th day of January, 1974, and continuing thereafter to
on or about the 28th day of February, 1974, in the County of Orange,
State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK,
and WILLIAM J. GOLDWAG did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously

1 take the personal property of Herbert F. Sagner consisting of money,
2 all of a total value in excess of two hundred dollars.

3 COUNT V: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
4 California, by this fifth count of this Indictment, hereby further
5 accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK, and WILLIAM J.
6 GOLDWAG of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of Sections 484-487 of the
7 Penal Code of the State of California, in that beginning on or
8 about the 25th day of February, 1974, and continuing thereafter
9 to on or about the 12th day of March, 1974, in the County of Orange
10 State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN, PAUL L. BLACK
11 and WILLIAM J. GOLDWAG did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously
12 attempt to take the personal property of Sharyn Dalton consisting
13 of money, all of a total value in excess of two hundred dollars.

14 COUNT VI: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
15 California, by this sixth count of this Indictment, hereby further
16 accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of
17 Sections 484-487 of the Penal Code of the State of California, in
18 that beginning on or about the 1st day of June, 1969, and contin-
19 uing thereafter to on or about the 30th day of November, 1973, in
20 the County of Orange, State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH
21 ALSLABEN did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously take the per-
22 sonal property of Patricia Gail Phillips consisting of money, all
23 of a total value in excess of two hundred dollars.

24 COUNT VII: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
25 California, by this seventh count of this Indictment, hereby further
26 accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of
27 Sections 484-487 of the Penal Code of the State of California, in
28 that beginning on or about the 1st day of January, 1973, and con-
tinuing thereafter to on or about the 20th day of February, 1973,
in the County of Orange, State of California, the said HARRY RU-
DOLPH ALSLABEN did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously take the
personal property of William G. Timmins, Jr. consisting of money,
all of a total value in excess of two hundred dollars.

COUNT VIII: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
California, by this eighth count of this Indictment, hereby further
accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of
Sections 484-487 of the Penal Code of the State of California, in
that beginning on or about the 1st day of April, 1973, and contin-
uing thereafter to on or about the 30th day of April, 1973, in the
County of Orange, State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH
ALSLABEN did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously take the per-
sonal property of William E. Huffman consisting of money, all of a
total value in excess of two hundred dollars.

COUNT IX: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
California, by this ninth count of this Indictment, hereby further
accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of
Sections 484-487 of the Penal Code of the State of California, in
that beginning on or about the 1st day of March, 1973, and con-
tinuing thereafter to on or about the 30th day of May, 1973, in
the County of Orange, State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH

1 ALSLABEN did willfully, unlawfully and feloniously take the per-
2 sonal property of Wanda Miller consisting of money, all of a total
3 value in excess of two hundred dollars.

3 COUNT X: The Grand Jury of the County of Orange, State of
4 California, by this tenth count of this Indictment, hereby further
5 accuses HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN of a Felony, to-wit: Violation of
6 Sections 484-487 of the Penal Code of the State of California, in
7 that beginning on or about the 1st day of May, 1973, and continuing
8 thereafter to on or about the 20th day of June, 1973, in the County
9 of Orange, State of California, the said HARRY RUDOLPH ALSLABEN did
10 willfully, unlawfully and feloniously take the personal property of
11 Charles Hansen consisting of money, all of a total value in excess
12 of two hundred dollars.

13 All of which is contrary to the form, force and effect of the
14 Statute in such cases made and provided, and against the peace and
15 dignity of the People of the State of California.
